Dear Pastors, Congregants & Churches of the Peninsula-Delaware Conference,

I come humbly to ask for your assistance in helping the pastors of the Evangelical Methodist Church of Nicaragua.

I will again visit our sisters and brothers on a teaching mission January 27 thru February 4, 2025, and will be traveling to four of the districts, helping the Methodist pastors there prepare for Lent. Most of the pastors, have received, little, if any pay this past year. Formerly, they received a bit of support from UMC Global Missions and the British Methodist Church but that has diminished significantly. It is my hope to be able to gift each of the 22 pastors at least \$100. I, along with my 2 churches, are committing to this and I respectfully ask you and your congregants to consider support of this effort. This small offering would be an enormous blessing and give hope to the pastors, families, churches and remind them that they are not alone.

I realize that the timing is short but we have just been able to work out the details of this mission. Please consider making a generous donation to the ministry of these pastors who serve sacrificially each and every day. Make your checks to: Rev. Karin Tunnéll, 289 E. North Street, Smyrna, DE 19977 or you may Zelle your contribution to me. [I will also arrange other forms of payment that may be convenient]. I will immediately send a receipt for your donations and pledge to send photos and/or videos to your church. I will also make myself available to visit your church for an update after my return.

Here are some details that may increase your understanding of the plight of the Evangelical Methodist Church of Nicaragua.

- \* Nicaragua is a huge country with stunning vistas and jaw-dropping poverty. It is the largest country of Central America about the size of the state of Alabama and is considered the second poorest nation of North America. According to the World Poverty Clock nearly half a million people live in extreme poverty, with the average annual salary of about \$263 for those who can secure a job. W Nicaragua is bordered to the north by Honduras and to the south by Costa Rica. It is bounded on the east by the Caribbean Sea and on the west by the Pacific Ocean.
- \* Initially Methodism came to Bluefields, Nicaragua on the Atlantic Coast in the 1880's but was unsuccessful.
- \* The first missionary to Nicaragua was in 1953 in Managua but they were forced to leave due to the civil war in 1978, with missionary work resuming in the 1980's. Belinda Forbes is one our foremost United Methodist missionaries and continues her work in Nicaragua with the AMOS project. You can learn more of Belinda'soutstanding ministry here

- \* The Nicaragua Managua Mission was organized in October 1989, with a membership of approximately 3,500.
- \* The Evangelical Methodist Church in Nicaragua was established in 1996 with support from the Council of Latin American Evangelical Methodist Churches (CIEMAL) and the General Board of Global Ministries (GBGM) of the United Methodist Church. The church has over 3,000 members. The Methodist Church in Britain has also supported the church through grants and roundtable meetings.
- \* Membership increased to 8,000 by December 1990.
- \* Most of the Methodist churches are located on the western part of the country, with churches in Managua, Masaya, León, La Majada, Loma Linda, among others, and Esteli and Jinotega to the north.
- \* This past year the government of Nicaragua has increased its sanctions upon the church, making the situation for pastors more untenable.
- \* IGLEMEN pastors are supposed to receive approximately \$150 per month, but that has not been paid in years. In addition, many of the churches and parsonages are in disrepair and I hope to assess how we might help in this effort.

If each of our 300 churches in the Conference contributed \$150 dollars to support these pastors and their families, we could provide them with nearly a year of salary each! Think about what a difference in their lives this would make.

To break it down even further:

If every member of a 150 member church contributed \$1, that would be \$150 OR

If a 75 member church contributed \$2 each – that would be \$150 OR

If you only have 30 members and everyone contributed \$5,

you would pay a Nica pastor's salary for one month.
